LA ZOO PAID STUDENT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM STUDENT WORKER (Student Intern for Conservation)

SALARY \$17.00 per hour

(The current salary range is subject to change. You may confirm the starting salary with the hiring department before accepting a job offer.)

SCHEDULE This paid internship program is tentatively scheduled to run June 17 – August 9, 2024, 25 hours per week. Mandatory orientation is scheduled for June 17th, 18th, and 20th. Specific shift days and hours may vary but must be available Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays throughout the 2024 internship program.

LOCATION Los Angeles Zoo – 5333 Zoo Drive, Los Angeles, CA 90027
Locations may also include Griffith Park or other City Department locations.

DUTIES / JOB DESCRIPTION

Conservation Interns will work directly with the Zoo's Conservation team, gaining real world application of science, research, and conservation skills. In July 2021, the Zoo released its first Conservation Strategic Plan (CSP), which guides its conservation efforts and expands its positive impact over the next five years. Key to this CSP is an increasing focus on local conservation projects that engage our community members, improve native biodiversity, and help meet the goals of local stakeholders in Los Angeles.

This internship will provide opportunities to:

- Gain career experience in zoo and conservation fields;
- Develop technical skills to conduct background research, data collection, and analysis through project-based learning; Choose a scientific study related to the native wildlife nearby or on the Zoo campus with peers, enact it, and present on their findings;
- Gain understanding of conservation, the role of the LA Zoo in it, and the importance of building accessibility and intergenerational stewardship capacity; and
- Conservation engagement opportunities with the community partners and the Zoo's Conservation Committee for networking opportunities and introduction to conservation-related careers and opportunities.

Position Expectations:

- Travel over uneven terrain up to 4 miles per day, sometimes transporting up to 15 pounds of supplies; Work outside and in varied weather conditions;
- Position self to observe plants and wildlife, including at ground level; and
- Inspection of natural sites to complete habitat assessments.

ABOUT THE ZOO

The Los Angeles Zoo property comprises 133 acres and is home to more than 2,200 mammals, birds, amphibians and reptiles representing more than 270 different species, 58 of which are endangered. In addition, the Zoo's botanical collection includes several planted gardens, over 800 different plant species and more than 7,000 individual plants.

The Zoo is owned and operated by the City of Los Angeles. The Zoo is operated and staffed by City employees as well as employees from its non-profit fundraising organization and concessionaire sub-contractor. In total, they represent approximately 350 full and part-time Zoo/City employees, and approximately 100 Zoo/City volunteers. The Zoo is open 363 days each year (closed Thanksgiving and Christmas days) and the annual attendance for the Zoo is approximately 1.5 million visitors.

On average, the Los Angeles Zoo and Botanical Gardens has almost 5,000 visitors a day with capacity days up to 10,000 or more visitors. The majority of our visitors are diverse families with young children. Throughout the year over 100,000 school group attendees also come to the Zoo.

The Zoo is a multi-faceted and unique work environment. The dynamic nature of Zoo operations requires flexible and motivated administrative staff who can work to address a multitude of issues. The ideal candidate for this position will be a versatile individual with interest and skills in business operations and administration, project management, and capital programming.
