SCHEDULE

Hours not to exceed 800 hours in a service year per employee; days off and shift schedule vary depending on operational needs; start time is typically between 7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m.

DUTIES / JOB DESCRIPTION

General responsibilities include, but are not limited to: cleaning, feeding/watering, animal observation, recordkeeping, and providing daily care for a variety of venomous and non-venomous reptiles, amphibians, fish, and invertebrates. Duties also include maintaining animal enclosures and work areas and routinely lifting and moving bags of salt, gravel, feed, and other materials weighing up to 50 lbs.

This is an at-will exempt intermittent position which can be terminated at any time without cause.

REQUIREMENTS

1. The equivalent of one year of full-time paid experience (2,080 hours) in the care and maintenance of exotic animals with a facility similar to the Los Angeles Zoo whose core function is the exhibition of a variety of exotic animals; **or**
2. Successful completion of the Animal Keeper Training program conducted by the Los Angeles Zoo; **or**
3. An equivalent program at an accredited school or college providing classroom and field work on the basic structure and function of exotic animals; basic nutritional requirements; recognition of the symptoms of animal diseases; sanitation measures; and aspects of animal behavior; **or**
4. Current status as an Animal Care volunteer with the Los Angeles Zoo; **or**



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5. Current employment as a Special Program Assistant II in the Commissary or Education Specialist with the Education Division; **and**
6. Must have a background in caring for exotic reptiles/amphibians/fish and invertebrates, and a willingness to work in cramped hot spaces with a team.

Desirable qualifications include reptile husbandry experience, particularly with venomous species; strong observation and communication skills; attention to detail; ability to work effectively in a team environment; and willingness to be fully trained in the care and handling of venomous reptiles and large crocodilians.

ABOUT THE ZOO

The Los Angeles Zoo property comprises 133 acres and is home to more than 1,500 mammals, birds, amphibians and reptiles representing more than 250 different species, 64 of which are endangered.

The Zoo is owned and operated by the City of Los Angeles. The Zoo is operated and staffed by City employees as well as employees from its partner organizations and sub-contractors. In total, they represent approximately 350 full and part-time Zoo/City employees, and approximately 400 volunteers. The Zoo is open 363 days each year (closed Thanksgiving and Christmas) and the annual attendance for the Zoo is approximately 1.5 million visitors.

On average, the Los Angeles Zoo welcomes almost 5,000 visitors a day with capacity days up to 10,000 or more visitors. Each year, more than 130,000 school group attendees also visit the Zoo.
